Warm-up: What's one thing you think older people understand better than younger people?

1 · Vocabulary

Word	Meaning	Example
generation gap	the difference in attitudes, values, and experiences between younger and older people	<i>The generation gap becomes evident when grandparents and grandchildren discuss technology.</i>
stereotype	an oversimplified idea about a group of people	<i>Many people stereotype teenagers as being lazy, which is not always true.</i>
tradition	customs or beliefs passed down from one generation to another	<i>Our family tradition of Sunday dinner helps bridge the generation gap.</i>
innovation	the introduction of new ideas, methods, or devices	<i>Innovation in smartphones has widened the generation gap in communication habits.</i>
perspective	a particular way of viewing something	<i>Listening to an older colleague's perspective can broaden your understanding.</i>
adapt	to adjust to new conditions or environments	<i>Young adults often have to adapt quickly to the fast-paced digital world.</i>
respectful	showing admiration or deference toward someone	<i>A respectful conversation can reduce tensions caused by the generation gap.</i>
miscommunication	failure to communicate ideas accurately	<i>Miscommunication between parents and teens often stems from differing expectations.</i>

2 · Discussion Questions

Take turns asking and answering — try to give a full answer, not just yes or no.

- 1 Can you tell me about a time when you felt a difference in opinion with a family member because of age?
- 2 What activities do you enjoy doing with older relatives, and why?
- 3 How often do you talk with people from a different generation, such as grandparents or younger siblings?
- 4 In your experience, what are some common misunderstandings between teenagers and adults?
- 5 Do you think technology has made the generation gap larger or smaller? Explain.
- 6 What stereotypes do you think exist about your own generation, and how accurate are they?
- 7 How can schools help bridge the generation gap between students and teachers?
- 8 What role do traditions play in either widening or narrowing the generation gap?
- 9 If you could design a community program to improve communication between age groups, what would it involve?
- 10 Do you believe the generation gap will disappear in the future? Why or why not?

3 · Extension

Try this: *Role-play: In pairs, one student acts as a teenager who wants to use a new app, the other as a parent worried about screen time. They must discuss their views and reach a compromise.*
