1 · Vocabulary

Word	Meaning	Example
fluent	able to speak or write a language easily and accurately	<i>After a year of study, she became fluent in Spanish.</i>
motivation	the reason or desire to do something	<i>His motivation to learn French grew after he visited Paris.</i>
challenge	a difficult task or problem	<i>Learning a new alphabet can be a big challenge.</i>
practice	repeated exercise to improve a skill	<i>Daily practice helps you remember new words.</i>
native	relating to a person's first language	<i>She can understand native speakers easily.</i>
accent	a distinctive way of pronouncing a language	<i>His accent changed after living in Italy for a year.</i>
immersion	being surrounded by a language or culture to learn it	<i>Immersion in a language school speeds up learning.</i>
progress	improvement or development over time	<i>You can see your progress when you can read a short story.</i>

- 9 How would you convince someone who thinks language learning is too hard to start?
- 10 If every country adopted bilingual education from primary school, how might societies change?

3 · Extension

Try this: *Role-play: One student acts as a language tutor, the other as a nervous learner who fears speaking. The tutor helps the learner build confidence by suggesting simple conversation starters and encouraging practice.*
