1 · Rules

- Adverbs of manner usually end in -ly and are placed after the main verb.
- Adverbs of frequency (always, often, never) are placed before the main verb, except after 'to be'.
- Adverbs of degree (very, too, quite) are placed before the adjective or another adverb they modify.
- When an adverb modifies the whole sentence, it can be placed at the beginning.
- Do not add -ly to adjectives that already end in -ly (e.g., 'quickly' not 'quicklyly').
