1 · Rules

- ◆ Use 'few' with countable plural nouns to show a small number.
- ◆ Use 'little' with uncountable nouns to show a small amount.
- ◆ Add 'a' before 'few' or 'little' for a positive meaning; without 'a' they sound more negative.
- ◆ When you want to emphasize scarcity, use 'few' or 'little' without 'a'.
