1 · Rules

- ◆ Use "will have" + past participle to talk about an action that will be completed before a specific future time.
- ◆ Future Perfect is often used with time expressions such as "by", "by the time", "before", "in ... years", etc.
- ◆ Do not use the base verb after "will have"; always use the past participle form.
- ◆ Negative form is created with "will not have" + past participle.
