- Form the perfect passive with the appropriate auxiliary (has/have/had/will have) + been + past participle.
- Use "by" to introduce the agent, but it is optional when the agent is unknown or irrelevant.
- In the present perfect passive, use "has/have been" followed by the past participle.
- For future perfect passive, use "will have been" followed by the past participle.
