- ◆ Use 'since' with a specific point in time and 'for' with a duration.
- ◆ Add 'already', 'just', 'yet', or 'ever' to give more information about timing.
- ◆ Form questions and negatives with 'have/has' before the subject.

2 · Signal words

already just yet ever since for never recently
