- ◆ Use "the" + adjective + "-est" for short adjectives (e.g., tall → the tallest).
- ◆ Use "the most" + adjective for long adjectives (e.g., interesting → the most interesting).
- ◆ Superlatives compare three or more items.
- ◆ Do not use a comparative form (e.g., "more" or "-er") with a superlative.
